Our History

Founded in 1938, St. Thomas More parish rose from humble beginnings. Parishioners attended Mass in what is now the school gymnasium until 1950. Beginning in 1960, mass was celebrated in what is now Burke Hall. The foundation of that church became the building in which we worship in today.

In 1974, St. Thomas More Parish became the Cathedral for the newly erected Diocese of Arlington. Many important diocesan liturgies are celebrated each year at the Cathedral of St. Thomas More and our bishop, the Most Rev. Paul Loverde, celebrates Sunday Mass here regularly.

As we conclude our celebrations of our 75th anniversary, we reflect on the fact that St. Thomas More Cathedral has grown into a vibrant parish family of over 2,500 souls. We are a multi-cultural community of faithful worshiping God according to the gifts given us by our Savior, Jesus Christ.

As with any family, there are growing pains. Over the past several years, through your generosity and diocesan commitment we have been able to accomplish numerous maintenance issues/repairs. Substantial work has been done to address water damage and exterior weather damage to the Church, Rectory and School. Through the help of the diocese we were able to completely renovate Burke Hall and expand bathroom facilities to accommodate many diocesan functions and social events as well as parish events. Through the annual Diocesan Lenten Appeal, we have been able to install a new lighting system to enhance the interior look of the Cathedral.

With a growing diverse faith community, we must look to address future needs and pave the way for the continued growth and ministry of St. Thomas More. That requires thought for the present and a vision for the future of our parish and our school.



Significant Service brings Significant Challenge

To meet the challenges of the future, the *Empowering God's Servants* Campaign addresses these critical needs.

Church Renovations

As the "mother church" of the Diocese of Arlington, our parish joyfully hosts many diocesan liturgies as well as those of our own community. At fifty-three years of age, our church building needs some additional attention.

Cathedral Center

St. Thora

This new center would accommodate our parish's youth programs, meeting rooms for parish and diocesan meetings and events, Young Adult activities as well as hosting diocesan CYO basketball games.

School Renovations

Our nationally recognized Blue Ribbon School of Excellence continues to grow in students, with increased enrollment expected well into the future. The new Cathedral Center frees up space in the school that, with the necessary funding, can be re-purposed into a media center and academic wing with additional classrooms and resource space.

New Organ Console

The Cathedral's organ console needs to be replaced after 44 years of continual use. It has been and will continue to be used by some of the world's most renowned organists in our Cathedral Concert Series.

Rainy Day Fund

Considering the spiraling costs of maintenance and upkeep, we need to establish a reserve fund that will continue to provide for our maintenance needs for the next few years, and also establish a beginning for endowing these needs for the future.
