From Our Rector

"My soul is sorrowful even to death. Remain here and keep watch with me."

In The Passion, the one Gospel in which all our voices are heard, we learn much about Jesus as man and as *Christ*; about us as judge and jury.

First, in his humanity Jesus teaches us a lot about suffering. The "agony in the garden" may pale in comparison to the excruciating agony of the Cross. But fear is a powerful emotion, and it is not hard to imagine Jesus' thoughts. As a Jew living in Roman times, he knew about their punishments. He knew about flogging ... crucifixion. He knew he was going to die. He also knew he was going to be betrayed by those who insisted, just hours before, that *they* would die for him.

And so he prayed; he begged; he sweated it out asking for God to spare him. In every moment we have ever pleaded with God to "take this cup" of illness, pain, hurt, addiction, humiliation from us we imitate Jesus in his humanity. He is us; he knows how we feel. The example he gives us is not just sacrificial; it is an acknowledgement that our prayers need to be tempered with a willingness to accept God's will. Saint Francis de Sales reminds us that God will "shield you from suffering or give you unfailing strength to bear it." We can get that strength internally and externally from others.

So, the "agony" also teaches us how to respond to the suffering of others. We shouldn't be too quick to judge the apostles that night. While we'd like to think we wouldn't have run away, have fallen asleep, or denied we knew Jesus, haven't we all done these at one time or another? Haven't we ever ignored that phone call or text from someone who needed us? Have we "fallen asleep" by not supporting someone going through a terrible illness? Have we denied "friends" or "family" when their lives are just too difficult to deal with? Jesus asks us to put aside our fears and discomfort to lend solace and peace to others. It oftentimes won't change the situation, but a journey shared is a journey eased.

I ask you, as we enter this most holy week, to be with Jesus, in prayer and with others. Reach out from your own Gethsemane and ask for his love; better still, be with someone in their own garden. Stay awake and "keep watch" with them.
