From Our Rector

"Clear out the old yeast, so that you may become a fresh batch of dough, inasmuch as you are unleavened."

Alleluia! He is Risen! Happy Easter!

I am going to start with an admission: I am not a cook. But I have been known to partake in one or two good meals and I will never turn away a great lemon cake. With my limited kitchen experience I do know, however, that you can tell if a dish has been made with old ingredients: spices a little past their prime, bread that might be a bit stale. In his letter to the Corinthians, St. Paul appeals to an experience we have all had. Lent has been our time to "clear out" the old habits and foibles that prevent us from truly rising to our better selves.

I spoke with a parishioner who mentioned that every Easter, without fail, their mother would ensure that all her children had freshly polished shoes, ironed shirts, perhaps even a new outfit. Hair combed, faces freshly scrubbed, they were ready to receive our Savior in their Sunday "best." Pictures showed a remarkable difference from the previous day!

That, my sisters and brothers, is Easter's message: transformation. Through the death and Resurrection of Jesus, we are never to be the same. Our world was never to be the same. He is the new Passover bread, leavened now with his sacrifice on the Cross.

But how to do we keep this amazing feeling (and it is amazing!) after the Easter basket is empty? Is Easter just another nice day to dress up and have a family meal? How long did we keep that "Christmas spirit" alive?

I would offer that our Lenten journey, and by default, our Easter season, should never end. While the Mass readings change and we hear Jesus' story retold, I would suggest that we keep these past six weeks in front of us. It's more than "giving up" something; it's more than the Paschal songs. Each Sunday we celebrate Easter: the sacrifice of the Mass reminds us of Christ's victory over death. Each Sunday we have the chance to become More. We are unfinished, as Saint Paul says. We are Lazarus bound but still stepping forward at Jesus' voice. So let's continue to "practice" our faith; let's continue that journey recognizing where it all began, and where we hope to land. Sing with me the Alleluia each Sunday with as much conviction as you do today.

After months of collaboration between admin, faculty and staff, and after careful review of a 200 page document, we are thrilled to announce that the visiting Design for Excellence (DFE) visiting team has recommended STM for full accreditation with the Virginia Catholic Education Association.

Since its inception, the 77 Catholic schools in Virginia have been successfully guided through the VCEA's accreditation process. In each case, the school community has completed a comprehensive self-study of its goals and how well its curriculum, student services, finances and facilities allow the school to achieve its goals. After the school has completed the self-study, a team of educators, not connected with the school, visits the school to judge the validity of the self-study and to suggest avenues of growth. Schools which successfully complete this process are accredited by the VCEA. ***Congratulations STM!***

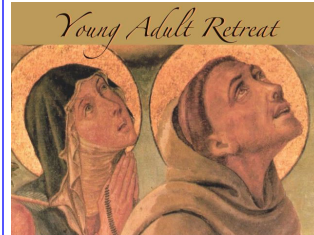

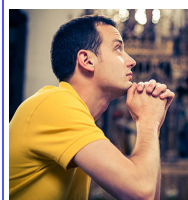

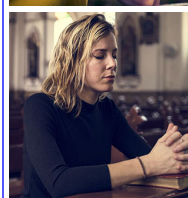
