As God, He is the creator of all things that exist. No one else is God but Him. He is where the buck stops. He has the power to do whatever He wills, whenever He wills, simply by willing it.</p> <p>Because He is all-powerful (and therefore all-knowing), God is also all just. We human beings are always limited in our administration of justice because we are not all-knowing, meaning we cannot know all the details and subtleties of individual moral cases, and because we are not all-powerful, which makes us incapable of dealing out a truly commensurate punishment. God does not have these limitations.</p> <p>But the aspect of God that is greatest, the aspect which the devil himself refuses to acknowledge, is that God is all good. We know this from reason, because the world is good, and God made the world. But we also know it by faith, by seeing in scripture how God cares for mankind throughout salvation history, even to the point of becoming one of us and laying down His life to save us, and how He continues to care for us through the sacraments and His providence in our lives.</p> <p>It is this last aspect, that of God's goodness, which is the hardest for us to accept.</p> <p>We have no trouble believing that God is all-powerful or all just. But we do have trouble at times believing in His goodness.</p> <p>Jesus told Saint Faustina in an apparition, "The flames of mercy are burning Me — clamoring to be spent; I want to keep pouring them out upon souls; souls just don't want to believe in My goodness."</p> <p>To believe in God's goodness requires us to trust in His MERCY. God knows all our faults, yet He still wants to forgive and heal us. Let us turn to His goodness!</p> <p>God Bless. Deacon Sean Nypaver</p>


Why do priests wear a Roman collar?

The practice of priests wearing the Roman collar developed in the mid-nineteenth century as an alternative to wearing the cassock which in some places was seen as impractical or which was even outlawed by anti-Catholic legislation. Since its introduction, it has taken different forms, and if you visit different countries today, you will see variation in what priests wear.

The Code of Canon Law simply observes that priests wear “suitable ecclesiastical garb” according to the judgments of the national bishops conferences and local custom (no. 284). The US Bishops have instructed that outside of liturgical functions, a “black suit and Roman collar are the usual formal attire for priests. The use of the cassock is at the discretion of the cleric.” Priests who are members of religious communities are to follow the rules of their institute regarding the habit or other approved clothing.

In the end, whether a priest wears the Roman collar, a religious habit, or, as is the case in many European countries, a suit and tie (to distinguish them from Protestant clergy who wear a collar) the goal of their clerical clothing is to serve as a sign of their commitment to guide and to serve, and to also allow them to be truly public figures because they are ordained for the service of all.



Diocese Announces New Paid Family and Medical Leave Policy.

The Diocese of Arlington now offers eight weeks of paid family and medical leave to about 3,000 lay employees, giving them a greater ability to address family needs resulting from childbirth, adoption, a close relative's illness, or their own medical concerns. Additionally, the Diocese has expanded its bereavement leave policy to provide employees who are scheduled to work 20 or more hours a week with up to 10 days of paid leave for the loss of a loved one, including a child lost in miscarriage.


