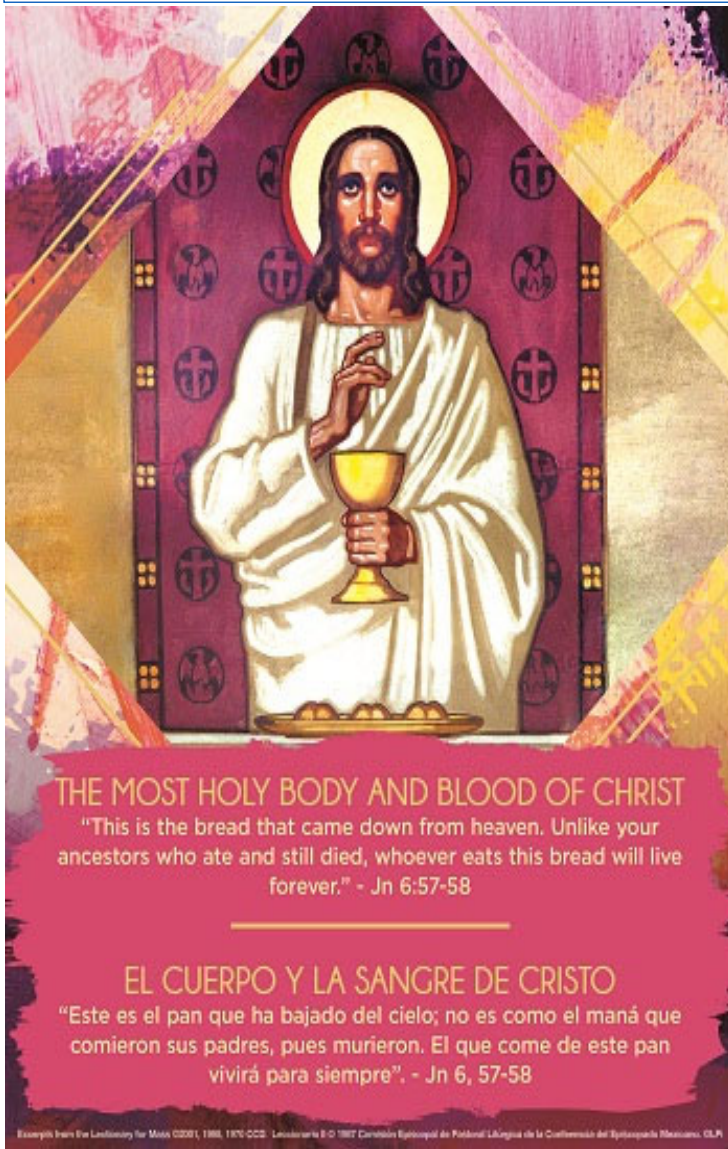

From Our Rector

"I am the living bread that came down from heaven; whoever eats this bread will live forever." (JN 6:51)

Most of us have been fortunate never to have experienced true hunger. But all of us can relate to feeling those pangs to some extent and the feeling of satisfaction when we finally have that piece of food. We need the proteins, vitamins, minerals etc. to live; we need the energy from our food to function. We know the difference in how we feel after a good meal: we can tackle those exams, that project, that long drive into work.

The Eucharist is our spiritual mainstay; it fills not our stomachs, but our souls. Just as though we gain repeated strength from healthy meals, we gain grace the more we partake in this, our most important sacrament. Communion becomes a literal thing, as we, a fellowship of faith, come one by one to receive Christ personally into our lives. His presence in the Body and Blood are the vehicles to grace. Because of this, we can "do all things through Christ;" we can face the trials born out of illness or separation, anger or hurt. We can go out from our pews and not just function as human beings, but live as Gospel witnesses.

My sisters and brothers, do not just go through the motions at Communion. As you receive, truly think upon the sacrifice made on your behalf that has brought you to this table. Open your hearts to Christ; allow His living presence to infuse your life. There is no expiration date on this spiritual food, no shelf life to its worth, no body it cannot heal.

Last week I had the privilege of presiding over our 8th grade graduation. Prayers and congratulations were offered as they are now off to learn new lessons and gain new experiences. For all those preparing for new beginnings, know our prayers remain with you, to sustain and ground you in the years to come.

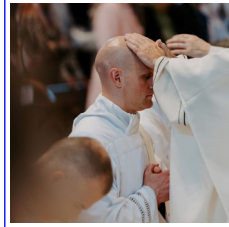

Reflecting More on: The Real Presence

Question:
How do you explain “Real Presence” to children?

Answer:
The first Communion class is filled with excitement to the point of bursting! They are just awestruck by every new thing they learn about Jesus. Their enthusiasm is contagious as they rattle off the names of the things in church, the vessels and vestments used at Mass, and the names of their pastors and priests. Of course, they know Christ can do anything because he’s God. He comes to us in holy Communion because he loves us so much that he wants to be with us. And he comes to us in the form of bread and wine. We really receive him in the Eucharist.

Sometimes it is easier to explain this to children than to adults. Their faith and trust in Jesus is not limited by the questions and doubts that often come with the question of how he does it. Rather, they focus on the question “why,” and the answer is something they can easily grasp: love. Christ wants to be with us because he loves us. Nothing is purer in truth or in faith. Not even the theological explanation of transubstantiation, or philosophical reasoning or symbolic references, come close. Christ takes on the form of bread and wine to be simple and approachable, so that no one is afraid or turned away. His love for us is complete and total. We try to love him the same way in return. For a child, it is simple. For us adults, we keep trying. “Unless you turn and become like children, you will not enter the kingdom of heaven” (Mt 18:3).

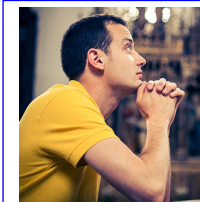
Porto Charities Advocacy Awards will be given to

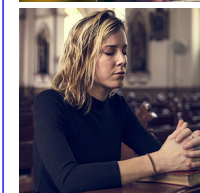
