From Our Deacon

"I heard the reproaches of many, and terror on every side."

This line from the prophet Jeremiah should resonate in us. Nobody likes it when others speak ill of them behind their back, let alone plot secretly against them to hurt them in some way.

And yet, this is what we can expect for being Christians. The Devil and his minions plot against us constantly, trying to deceive us and snatch us from the hand of God.

Nothing is more infuriating to Satan than our salvation. He will do all he can to thwart it.

Satan is smart. Much smarter than we are. He has a greater intellect than we do -- before he fell, he was the highest of the angels, and was named Lucifer, which means "Light-Bearer" -- and he has been lying and deceiving from the beginning of time. He's an expert at what he does.

However, despite his intellect and experience, we have the sure advantage, if, and only if, we remain in Jesus.

The Devil is very clever, but he cannot read our minds and hearts. Only God can do that, as the prophet reminds us.

At the end of our lives, we will see all of our actions. "Nothing is hidden that will not be revealed." The Devil will accuse us, but if we are faithful to Jesus in this life, He Himself will defend us, showing to the Father the wounds He suffered for our sake.

If we ever feel afraid because of the persecution we face, interiorly or exteriorly, if we ever feel accused or not worthy of being saved, let us take comfort in the words of Jesus in this Sunday's gospel:

"Are not two sparrows sold for a small coin? Yet not one of them falls to the ground without your Father's knowledge. Even all the hairs of your head are counted. So do not be afraid; you are worth more than many sparrows."

God loves each of us as if we were the only thing He created. Let the only thing we fear be to offend our Loving Father in heaven.

Reflecting More on: Scripture

First Reading:

We hear how the prophet Jeremiah turned to God when he felt alone and attacked. What do you need to pray to God for this week?

Second Reading:

Paul taught that through the grace of God, Christ reversed the sin of Adam, which brought death to all. When have you felt God's grace in your life?

Gospel:

Jesus encourages his disciples not to be afraid. What are some fears you have that you could turn over to God?

WHY DO WE DO THAT?

What is Lectio Divina, and how is it associated with the Benedictine Monastic tradition, whose founder, St. Benedict, we honor on July 11?

Benedict desired his monks to live in community, praying the Liturgy of the Hours together, contemplating sacred texts, and doing manual labor. The monks developed a technique to facilitate a spiritual and devotional reading of the Bible known as Lectio Divina, the holy reading of a text. This method encourages the reader to hear the biblical text with an open heart and focus on whatever God wants to highlight and then apply it to daily life. There are variations on Lectio Divina, but essentially, the technique consists of a three-step process of reflection. When the reflection is done with a group, the responses are shared by all the participants. Once the text is selected, it is read meditatively, and the following are then explored: a word or phrase that attracts you; how and where the content of this reading touches your life today; what you believe that God wants you to do during this coming week (month, year, lifetime).

Thanks to Benedict, the Christian community has been gifted with this special way of entering into the biblical text. This week, use the Lectio Divina process on one of the readings for the coming Sunday and make a note of the life connections you are making. How is this reflection on the biblical text drawing you closer to God and others?

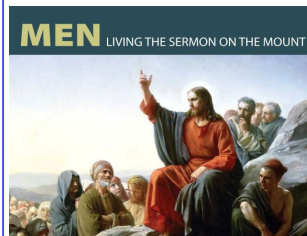

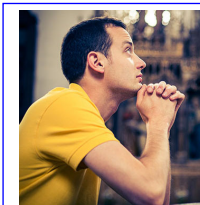

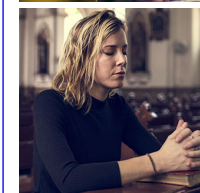
