

#### From Our Rector



"How do we get there?"

Back in the days before Google, maps were a real thing: all paper and lines and coordinates. To get where you wanted to go, you had to plot your course; follow the lines to your destination. You got lost? There was no soothing voice saying "recalculating."

In today's Gospel, Thomas asks: "how can we know the way?" The disciples still cannot fully grasp that **Jesus is the vehicle** of salvation; He will lead them to the Father. They want to be


sure; they want to know how. They want directions.

As we saw in last week's Gospel, Jesus is both gate and guide to the Father. It is through a relationship with Him that we come to know the Father fully, and, how we will ultimately come to be with Him.

In the Creed we recite, "through Him all things are made." It is Christ, actively present within us, which completes our lives, lends purpose and direction to it. With Christ all relationships take on new meaning. In others we see His face, hear His voice and in so doing, share in their hopes, fears and joys.

Jobs may come and go; people may leave or disappoint us; that new car will eventually lose that "new car smell." These and so many other things of our world may ultimately leave us feeling empty. A relationship with Christ puts all these in context; we are able to be in communion with others, and our world at large, when we allow Christ to be our focal point. With Christ we will "know the way."

Today we honor our mothers, those who hope to become mothers and those whose maternal love support and guide us. By their example we come to know unconditional love, which mirrors the love God has for us. While for some this day means breakfast in bed and flowers, I know that for others there may be no Hallmark moment. Fractured relationships, unrealized dreams, or grief, might be the order of your day. To all, I offer my sincere prayers and encouragement, and ask you to reach out: to reaffirm a strong relationship or repair a broken one. If this is not possible, then I ask you to be as a mother to someone else: to give of yourself freely and unreservedly, to love as Mary loved – with strength of heart and firmness of faith. ~Fr. 

"The stone which the builders rejected has become the cornerstone." 1 Peter 2:7


