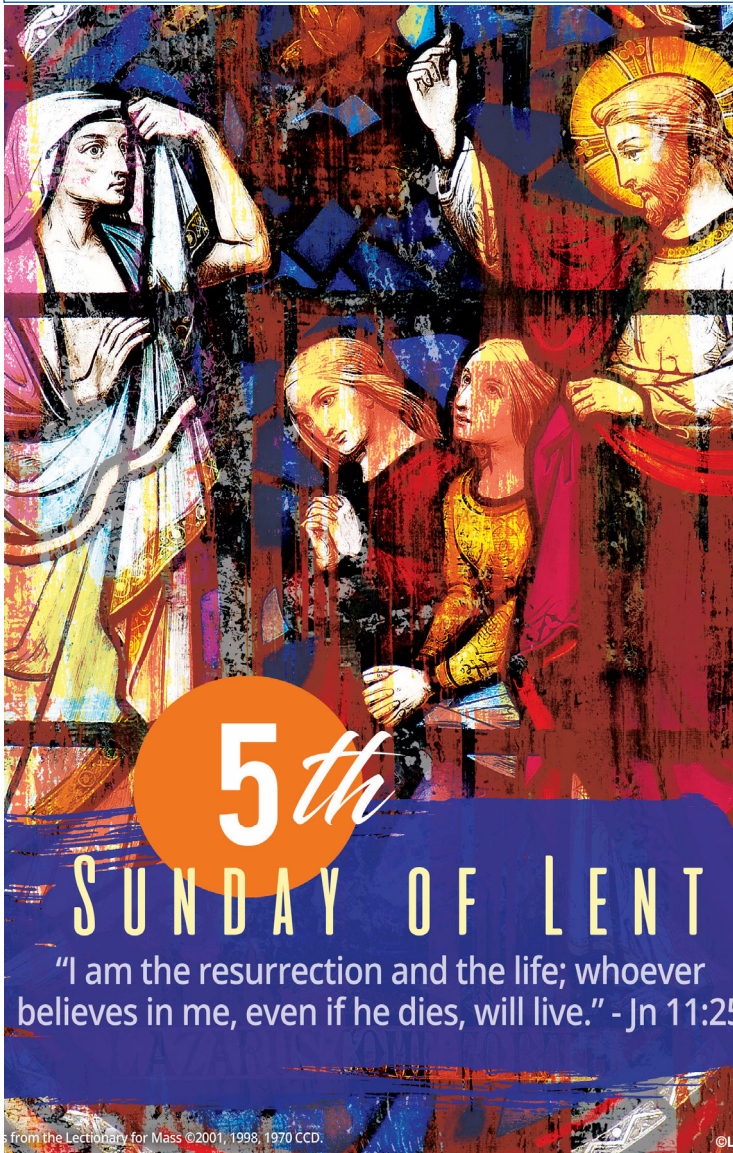

“Untie him and let him go.”

Today we once again hear of Lazarus’ resurrection, a clear foretelling of Christ’s own Resurrection – the ultimate sign of God’s power over death and His victory over sin. As Lazarus was bound in the tomb, so too can we be bound by our sins, hurts, and fears which only separate us from the love of Christ. None of us are immune to these, priest or layperson alike. We all sin and are sinned against. When Pope Francis was asked to describe himself, he famously said “I am a sinner whom the Lord looked upon with mercy.”

It is easy to let sin overtake us, wrapping itself tighter around us until we are like Lazarus: bound by it completely. I am not talking about mortal sins, but the more insidious kinds which slowly make their way into our hearts. I have often said the greatest of these could be pride. This sense of self-righteousness can blind us to our own failings and make it impossible to forgive the failings of others. “I would never do that!” It can make us overlook that gossip we shared, the lie we told, the understanding we withheld. It can make us turn away from those in need. It can make us hold a grudge. It can ruin marriages, friendships and working relationships.

Christ calls to us just as He did to Lazarus: COME OUT! “Take away the stone,” that keeps you from a relationship with God, that divides our personal lives. Unburden yourself through Confession; make amends with someone you have hurt. Allow others to free themselves of sin by forgiving them.

It comes down to one central question: “I am the resurrection and the life; do you believe this?” Who do you believe Jesus to be? Do you believe His teachings? Do you share His mercy? When He calls you to RISE will you hear His voice?

Our path to the Resurrection continues. And the next time we read about a stone being rolled away, we will see and believe anew in God’s glory and great love for us.

My dear sisters and brothers in Christ,

As the Cathedral renovations begin in earnest, we wish to thank you again for your patience, support, and understanding as we best manage the effects of the construction.

The renovation of the Cathedral will be in three major phases.

- The first phase is the installation of the HVAC system (started February 27, 2023) in Burke Hall which will be substantially complete before Easter (April 9, 2023).
- The second phase begins on Monday, April 10, 2023 (Easter Monday). The Cathedral proper will close for weekday and weekend Masses, shifting Mass to Burke and Lee (School Gym) Halls. At this time, fencing will be erected around the Cathedral blocking the side entrances. Entrance to Burke Hall will be through the front of the Cathedral by the Christ the Redeemer statue. The sidewalk closest to the rectory and bell tower will remain open and you will be able to utilize the sidewalk leading to the front of the Cathedral. If you need an accessible entrance, the ramp closest to the [Bishop's](#) residence will be open with a covered pathway through the Cathedral to the elevator. Burke Hall seating capacity will be reduced to 175 spaces as structural supports are temporarily installed inside the hall as a function of the upstairs renovation. See the website for a diagram and more details.
- The third phase involves the exterior renovation and will begin once the second phase is complete (estimated December 2023). The Cathedral proper will reopen for Mass and the front entrance will be closed. The side entrances will be open.

Sunday Mass and Seating Capacity in Burke Hall

To serve and meet our parishioner's spiritual needs, we have increased the number of Masses offered on Saturday and Sunday to accommodate the reduced number of seats (175 seats). The new Mass schedule is as follows:

Saturday Vigil:	4:30 pm and 6:00 pm in Burke Hall
Sunday:	7:00 am (quiet Mass), 8:00 am, 9:30 am, 11:15 am (Cathedral Choir), 12:45 pm and 7:00 pm in Burke Hall
Sunday:	10:00 am and 1:00 pm Spanish Mass in the Lee Hall (School Gym)

To ensure that all who want to attend Mass can be accommodated, we are suggesting that you sign up for the first few weeks. **It is not required; however, it is encouraged** so that all parishioners can make an informed decision about available seating. Sign-ups are temporary until we adjust to the new schedule. Sign-up information will be on the Cathedral website, in the bulletin, and the **Connection**, our weekly electronic newsletter.

Weekday Mass, Private Prayer, Adoration, Evening Prayer, Confessions and Holy Days of Obligation
Weekday Services will continue with 7:00 am and 12:05 pm Mass with the Rosary beginning at 11:40 am. The Divine Mercy Chaplet will continue after Mass, but all must vacate the hall by 1:00 pm to allow the contractors to resume work. We will continue to have Saturday morning Mass at 9:00 am in Burke Hall.

Private prayer during the week in Burke Hall will be available Mondays – Fridays after Mass from 7:30 – 8:00 am and 12:30 – 1:00 pm.

Adoration and Evening Prayer on Thursdays will be suspended, resuming upon work completion.

Confessions will continue to be held on Thursday evenings from 7:00 – 8:00 pm and on Saturdays from 3:00 – 4:00 pm. *Please note the new Saturday confession time.* The music room and the credit union office will serve as the confessionals.

Please check the bulletin, website, and social media for schedule of Masses on Holy Days of Obligation and Federal Holidays.

Mass Intentions

We have added Masses and therefore intentions to our schedule; please check with the parish office and see if a new Mass time is available to celebrate or honor your loved one.

If there was ever a time that we needed help, now is it. The expanded Mass schedule will place a burden upon our current volunteers. If you are interested in joining one of these ministries, please contact the parish office and we will work with the ministries to get you trained as soon as possible.

Livestreaming



Mensaje Importante sobre la Renovación de la Catedral

Marzo, 2023

Mis queridas hermanas y hermanos en Cristo,

A medida que las renovaciones de la Catedral comienzan, queremos agradecerles nuevamente por su paciencia, apoyo y comprensión mientras manejamos mejor manera, los efectos de la construcción.

La renovación de la Catedral se realizará en tres grandes fases.

- La primera fase es la instalación del sistema HVAC (que comenzó el 27 de Febrero, 2023) en Burke Hall, que estará sustancialmente completa antes de Pascua (9 de Abril, 2023).
- La segunda fase comienza el Lunes 10 de Abril, 2023 (Lunes de Pascua). La Catedral propiamente dicha cerrará para las Misas de Lunes a Viernes y los fines de semana, cambiando la Misa al Burke Hall y Lee Hall (Gimnasio Escolar). En este momento, se levantará un cerco alrededor de la Catedral bloqueando las entradas laterales. La entrada a Burke Hall será por el frente de la Catedral junto a la estatua del Cristo Redentor. La acera más cercana a la rectoría y el campanario permanecerán abiertas y podrá usar la acera que conduce al frente de la Catedral. Si necesita una entrada accesible, la rampa más cercana a la residencia del obispo estará abierta con un camino cubierto a través de la Catedral hasta el ascensor. La capacidad de asientos de Burke Hall se reducirá a 175 espacios, ya que los soportes estructurales se instalarán temporalmente dentro de la sala para la renovación del piso superior. Visite el sitio web para ver un diagrama y más detalles.
- La tercera fase implica la renovación exterior y comenzará una vez que se complete la segunda fase (estimado en Diciembre de 2023). La Catedral propiamente dicha reabrirá para misa y la entrada principal estará cerrada. Las entradas laterales estarán abiertas.

Misa dominical y capacidad de asientos en Burke Hall

Para servir y satisfacer las necesidades espirituales de nuestros feligreses, hemos aumentado la cantidad de Misas ofrecidas los sábados y domingos para acomodar la cantidad reducida de asientos (175 asientos). El nuevo horario de Misas es el siguiente:

Sábado Vigilia: 4:30 pm y **6:00 pm** en Burke Hall

Domingo: 7:00 am (Misa tranquila), 8:00 am, 9:30 am, 11:15 am (Coro de la Catedral), 12:45 pm y 7:00 pm en Burke Hall

Domingo: 10:00 am y 1:00 pm Misa en Español en el Lee Hall (Gimnasio de la escuela)

Para garantizar que todos los que quieran asistir a Misa puedan ser acomodados, sugerimos que se registre durante las primeras semanas. No es requerido; sin embargo, se alienta para que todos los feligreses puedan tomar una decisión informada sobre los asientos disponibles. Las inscripciones son temporales hasta que nos ajustemos al nuevo horario. La información para registrarse estará en el sitio web de la Catedral, en el boletín y en Connection, nuestro boletín electrónico semanal.

Misa entre semana, Oración privada, Adoración, Oración vespertina, Confesiones y Días de precepto

Los servicios entre semana continuarán con Misa de 7:00 am y 12:05 pm con el Rosario a partir de las 11:40 am. La Coronilla de la Divina Misericordia continuará después de la Misa, pero todos deben desalojar el salón a la 1:00 p. m. para permitir que los contratadores reanuden el trabajo. La misa de Sábado a las 9:00am también continuará.

La oración privada durante la semana en Burke Hall estará disponible de lunes a viernes después de misa de 7:30 a 8:00 am y de 12:30 a 1:00 pm.

La adoración y la oración vespertina de los Jueves se suspenderán y se reanudarán al finalizar el trabajo.

Las confesiones continuarán realizándose los Jueves por la noche de 7:00 a 8:00 p. m. y los Sábados de 3:00 - 4:00 p. m. Tenga en cuenta el nuevo horario de confesión del Sábado. El salón de música y la oficina de la cooperativa de ahorro y crédito servirán como confesionarios.

Transmisión en vivo


