



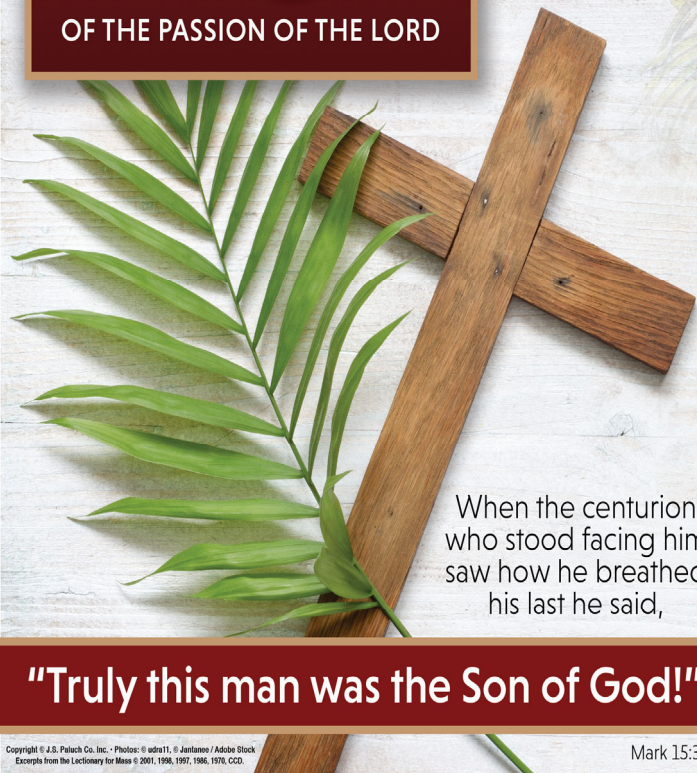

“Many people spread their cloaks on the road, and others spread leafy branches ...crying out: “Hosanna! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord!” (Mark 11:8-9)

“And when they had mocked him, they stripped him of the purple cloak, dressed him in his own clothes, and led him out to crucify him.” (Mark 14:20)

Two roads. The first, covered with branches and cloaks with a crowd shouting blessings; the other, scarred by rocks, strewn with blood, sweat and teeming with hate.

I will go out on a limb and say most of us prefer the Jerusalem route. We’d like a life paved smooth by our plans, without rocks causing us to stumble or alter our route. Maybe this sounds familiar: school, perhaps post-graduate studies, a fulfilling job, marriage and, after a sufficient time children, then onward to blissful retirement.

But what if God’s plan takes you on a different path? What if He is calling you to a different challenge? What if He wants more from you so that you can give more to others? Perhaps the job isn’t really everything; perhaps the family you longed for arrives in unexpected ways; perhaps God asks you to sacrifice all to serve His people. Perhaps He calls you to a love you thought you were incapable of giving. How do you move forward? Especially today when, though we see glimmers of “normalcy” with the arrival of vaccines, our lives are still in flux. Our hearts are still unsettled and our minds, uneasy.

By letting Him enter your life, through the grace of the Sacraments and the love of community. The Eucharist is more than a sliver of bread; Confession is more than just words spoken in confidence. Our neighbors are more than people on our street. Christ enters into our lives through each and the more we partake of them, the more we feel His presence.

It is this presence which travels with us. Jerusalem and Golgotha are not really two separate roads, but stops along the way leading us to our Father. It is Christ’s grace which gives us direction; His grace which loosens the knots that bind us; and His grace, as the song goes, “will lead us home.” God Bless. Fr. Posey

Understanding the Triduum

We have come to the threshold of The Holy Triduum, The Three Days. These are the days when God moves most profoundly among us, In word, symbol and gesture, we celebrate the mysteries of life, death and resurrection in company with the Risen Christ who shows us the way.

HOLY THURSDAY The day begins with the **Chrism Mass, 10:30am**, where Bishop blesses the holy oils used in Sacraments. It is also the time when our priests rededicate themselves to be “God’s servants;” to be “in persona Christi,” Christ before us. This Mass is closed to public but will be live-streamed. **Mass of the Lord’s Supper 7:30 pm.** The Gospel leaves no room for doubt, the most humble service given in love surrounds the gift of Christ’s Body and Blood. Wine and wafer are consecrated, enough for tomorrow when even sacraments are silent. Procession with the Eucharist from the church to the altar of repose. Adoration through the last hours of the day, until midnight, when Friday’s fast begins. This day reminds us of the centrality of the Eucharist, the importance of the priesthood, and the love of God which binds us as a family of faith.

GOOD FRIDAY Passion of the Lord & Veneration of the Cross 3:00pm We come to stand with the women and the beloved disciple to listen to the Passion according to St. John. We partake in this simple liturgy, to face the great “paradox” of our faith: salvation through suffering and death. We recall that awful road to Golgatha. We partake of the Eucharist, a solemn reminder of the sacrifice made on our behalf. A single cross is lifted high for our veneration together, then placed at the altar steps. We leave an empty church in silence.

Easter Vigil 8:30pm
“Mother of all vigils.” This is St. Augustine’s name for tonight, a name that conveys how the church cherishes this night that is different from any other. A vigil is a night watch: people who would normally be home resting are awake, gathered in expectation, waiting for news. We wait in a great company, as Christians around the world keep watch. Nothing is ordinary about this evening we spend together. The Vigil is long and full. It begins outside with Fire, kindled in the presence of our elect, our candidates and those who accompany them. The Paschal Candle is ignited from that fire and carried into the darkened church where all our candles are lit from that flame.

We hear the **EXSULTET – THE EASTER PROCLAMATION.** This is the night when Christ broke the bonds of death and rose victorious from the grave. In the light of the Easter candle, we listen to God’s Word, the story of our salvation. Women and men from our assembly come, one after another, to proclaim the Word.

Readings announce how God saves His people throughout history, pursuing us with unrelenting affection. These stories take time to tell and to savor, and call us to respond in psalm and in prayer. The Gloria sounds again after Lenten silence, and the Alleluia. Lights are thrown on. Bells ring. Led to faith by God's Word and by God's people. Water is blessed and poured over catechumens . They are wrapped in the white garment of Christ's life and are given the new light of Christ. Called to remember and renew our own baptism, we stand to embrace the saving waters. We acclaim our candidates as they reaffirm their baptism and, with the newly baptized, are sealed and confirmed with the oil of chrism. The congregation is sprinkled with Holy Water and together reaffirm their own baptismal promises. Together we encounter the Risen Lord in the Eucharist. The “Mother of all Vigils” unites the Catholic family, enriches our faith, and gives us the grace to be “fishers of men.”

The Great Sunday, the Feast of Fifty Days begins! The fifty days from Easter to Pentecost are celebrated as one feast day, The Great Sunday. We are reborn, renewed, and rejuvenated in the light of the Pascal candle: our faith ready to “shine before men. That they may see the good that we do and give glory to God.”

He is Risen and We are Risen to New Life!

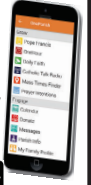
