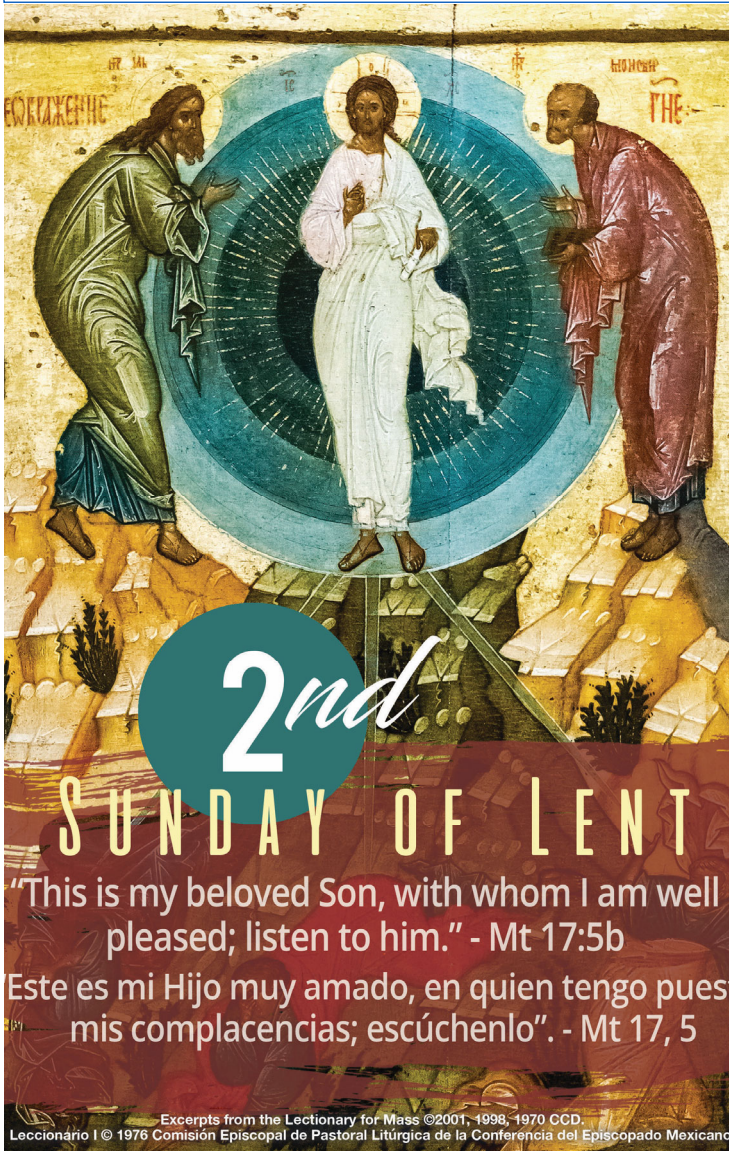

"Lord, it is good that we are here. ..."
 Today's Gospel takes us to a mountain where Peter, James, and John witness Jesus' transfiguration; he becomes something breathtaking, profound, and new. We use this word a lot today: in ads for diet programs, Pinterest posts on changing your home, your clothes, your look. To be transfigured is to undergo a literal transformation that you can see and experience. We don't often hear of transfiguring a soul.

The other day I was speaking with a former parishioner who spoke of attending her son's graduation from a drug and mental health program. Before a crowded room of others also journeying towards healthier living, six young men stood and told their stories. Stories which, while the details varied, all spoke of struggle, loss, fear, and heartache. Through trial, and many errors, each man had finally trusted those around them enough to change the trajectory of their lives. Staff and family spoke as well acknowledging the work done by the graduates, the blessing of outside support, and the power of God's interaction.

I saw a photo from that ceremony and the change was palpable in their son, and in the other men. Not just physically, though they all looked markedly different from when they entered the program. It was as if their spirits had been reawakened to the gift of sobriety, of course, but to life itself. To be able to work, to be a friend, a brother, a son, to love themselves and others was truly a beautiful transfiguration. This parent encouraged all the men in the program there to remember that they are blessings and are *worthy, and worth* the effort. They are, "as the poem *Invictus* says, 'master[s] of [their]fates and captain[s] of their souls.'"

Last week we placed ashes on our foreheads, the remnants of what were the palms gloriously heralding Christ's arrival in Jerusalem. Those palms, transfigured, changed, into symbols not of death, but of life, heralding our own triumphal return one day to Our Father in heaven.
