“I will not leave you orphans; I will come to you. In a little while the world will no longer see me, but you will see me, because I live and you will live.” John 14

“The Lord God said, ‘It is not good for the man to be alone.’” Genesis 2:18

From the very first, God creates from love, out of love, and for love. We are meant to be children of God, made with a “spark of the divine” to reflect his image to others. This kinship is replayed, reinforced, and renewed throughout history. Through his sacrifice, Christ repairs our relationship injured by sin. His resurrection allows for our salvation and eternal life with him.

Jesus seeks to reassure his disciples, confused and afraid, that regardless of the events to come, he will remain with them. He promises the Holy Spirit, which will live in their hearts and minds, and which will guide their actions. Yet, this is their friend who is telling them he’s going to die; what kind of “peace” will there be for them?

Last week I mentioned that these verses from John are often used in funeral liturgies. When I say Mass for a family, especially one that has lost a father, mother, sibling, or friend at a young age, I am keenly aware of feelings of abandonment, of being adrift. We want the peace that the “world gives;” perhaps for that person to remain with us. But Christ’s lessons move us beyond the here and now, sometimes grudgingly, sometimes painfully. But always with the assurance that God does not leave us alone in our grief but pours himself out to us through the Spirit at work in others.

We say that people live on in the lives of their children or those they loved. Perhaps there is a familial likeness (people tell me I resemble my father); perhaps it’s a way of speaking, or continuing traditions. We keep the love of God alive in the Sacraments and in our deeds. With each act of kindness, with each conversation with God, we maintain that connection. As Saint Paul tells us, nothing can separate us from the love of Christ, and if we allow, the love for one another.


Today we honor our mothers and women who serve as models of selfless devotion. If you are blessed with a good relationship, give thanks! If you are suffering through loss or absence, I pray for comfort. May we always look to our Blessed Mother as example and guide.

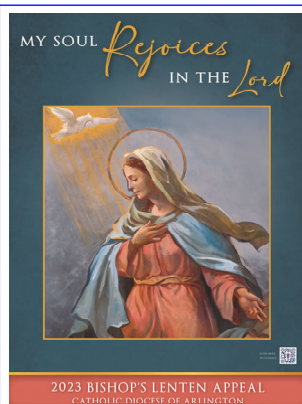
From our Rector, Father Posey:

A covered walkway was constructed at the front entrance of the Cathedral. Please use the new entrance to access Burke Hall. In addition, as Forrester Construction Company begins exterior work, there will be a need to bump out the fence near the Baptism of Christ stained glass window. Mass attendees will be re-routed up the ramp and down the stairs which are in front of the Rectory office. Please note that the accessible entrance that leads to the elevator as well as the sidewalk along Cathedral Lane are also convenient routes to access Burke Hall for Mass.

After reviewing scheduling and seating over these first few weeks, we have decided to combine the 4:30 and 6:00pm Saturday Vigil Masses and return to one Mass at 5:00pm. We are omitting the 12:45pm Sunday Mass. As always, we are grateful for your understanding and patience.

More on: Servant of God Marie-Rose Juliette Toussaint

Marie-Rose Juliette Toussaint was born Marie-Rose Gaston in 1786 in Saint Domingue, present day Haiti. She & her family were enslaved and moved with their enslavers, the Noels, to Baltimore during the Haitian Revolution. In her early 20's, she met Venerable Pierre Toussaint — also on his way toward sainthood right now — an affluent New York man who had been enslaved and also immigrated from Haiti. He purchased her freedom, and they were married on August 5, 1811.

Juliette and Pierre quickly established themselves as a charitable force in New York City! The adopted Euphémie, the daughter of Pierre's late sister, who died of tuberculosis. Throughout their life together, Juliette and Pierre also adopted numerous black children from the streets of New York. They would shelter travelers and homeless folk, went to daily Mass and participated in many local ministries.

They worked together to continue their daily jobs but also to establish careers of charity. During yellow fever outbreaks, the couple temporarily repurposed their home as an infirmary to care for the sick in their neighborhood. Together, they created an employment agency for immigrants and freed slaves, a refuge for retired priests, and they even organized a credit bureau!

Later in life, with a congregation of sisters — the Oblate Sisters of Providence — Juliette and her husband helped fund the establishment of the very first New York City Catholic School for Black Children. They also helped finance the building of a new Roman Catholic church which became The Basilica of St. Patrick's Old Cathedral in Lower Manhattan and is still in use today, as well as helped finance St. Vincent De Paul church on New York's Canal Street. Secular causes also got attention from Juliette. She is credited with gifting the New York African Society for Mutual Relief the property on which they built their meeting hall!

Juliette died of natural causes on May 14, 1851, at the age of 65 and is buried along with her husband and their child at the church they helped build, Old St. Patrick's. She is recognized as a Servant of God for her incredible virtue and holiness.

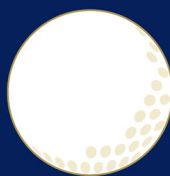

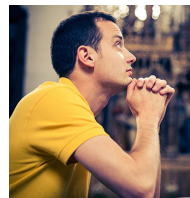

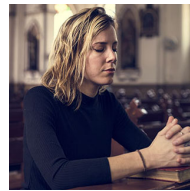
