From Our Rector

"When the Lord established the heavens I was there, when he marked out the vault over the face of the deep; when he made firm the skies above, when he fixed fast the foundations of the earth; when he set for the sea its limit, so that the waters should not transgress his command; then was I beside him as his craftsman, and I was his delight day by day, playing before him all the while, playing on the surface of his earth; and I found delight in the human race." (Proverbs 8:27-31)

It can be difficult to preach about the Holy Spirit; the Trinity is not something easily understood and certainly the Holy Spirit is not as tangibly identifiable as is The Father (our Creator) and The Son (our Savior). We see examples of the Father's handiwork every day; we know Jesus Christ was born, died and rose from the dead. But how do we grasp the Third Person of the Trinity?

I've always liked the reading from Proverbs for it reminds us of two things: that we were made to reflect God's joy in His creation and that the Spirit was there from the beginning. Our salvation is dependent upon not just God's mercy but the gifts that the Spirit brings. We teach our young Confirmandi what those seven gifts are (Wisdom, Understanding, Counsel, Knowledge, Fortitude, Piety, & Fear of the Lord) and at Pentecost we celebrate those. It's important to note that each of these completes our discipleship, each serving as a bridge between our Creator and Savior. The Spirit becomes that unseen guiding hand, a conscience if you will, leading us along the right path.

I was ordained May 18, 1991; and I know with certainty that it was and always has been the Holy Spirit giving me the strength and wisdom to serve. It was there as I left for the Missions, with only 90 days training in Spanish; there during those eight years as I worked in less-than favorable conditions but always imbued with Christ's call; there at my first assignment as a Pastor in Purcellville, then Falls Church, and now here as I try to be your servant-priest. The Spirit resides in all of us; as we move through our lives be open to its gifts. God did not leave the disciples alone; so too He does not leave us without resources. Even when fear stands in our way; when indifference creeps into our lives, when we feel we cannot study more diligently, work harder, or love more the Spirit will provide us the reserves we need. It will "not disappoint, because the love of God has been poured out into our hearts through the Holy Spirit that has been given to us."

Cathedral Renovation Updates

A covered walkway was constructed at the front entrance of the Cathedral. Please use the new entrance to access Burke Hall. In addition, as Forrester Construction Company begins exterior work, there will be a need to bump out the fence near the Baptism of Christ stained glass window. Mass attendees will be re-routed up the ramp and down the stairs which are in front of the Rectory office. Please note that the accessible entrance that leads to the elevator as well as the sidewalk along Cathedral Lane are also convenient routes to access Burke Hall for Mass.

After reviewing scheduling and seating over these first few weeks, we have decided to combine the 4:30 and 6:00pm Saturday Vigil Masses and return to one Mass at 5:00pm. We are omitting the 12:45pm Sunday Mass. As always, we are grateful for your understanding and patience.

Please note that the Rectory Office and School will be closed next Monday, May 29, in observance of Memorial Day. There will be one Daily Mass at 10:00am. The Office and School will reopen on Tuesday, May 29.

More on: Why Does the Church Have Different Liturgical Cycles?

While most Catholics know that the Church Year is divided into various seasons (e.g. Advent, Christmas, Ordinary Time, etc.), many are unaware that the one Church Year is not like the one that follows. While the main seasons and feasts are the same from year to year, the three-year cycle for Sundays and the two-year cycle for weekdays means that, as a general rule, the readings in the Lectionary that we hear at Mass will change from year to year, helping us to have a richer encounter with Sacred Scripture. Each new cycle begins with the beginning of the liturgical year, the First Sunday of Advent.

The reasoning behind this innovation is outlined in *Sacrosanctum Concilium*, the “Dogmatic Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy” of the Second Vatican Council: “The treasures of the bible are to be opened up more lavishly, so that richer fare may be provided for the faithful at the table of God’s word. In this way a more representative portion of the holy scriptures will be read to the people in the course of a prescribed number of years” (no. 51). This was fully achieved in 1969 when the new cycles of readings were approved by Pope Saint Paul VI.

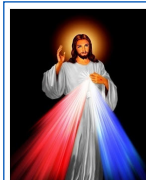

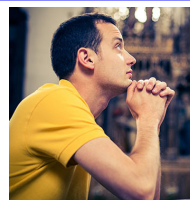

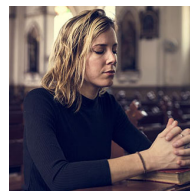
