

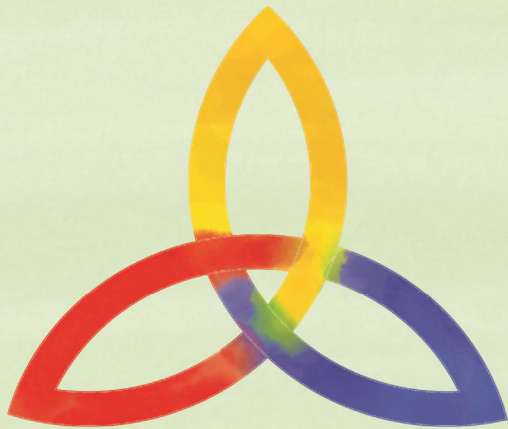

Did anything so great ever happen before?”  
 (Deuteronomy 4:32ff)

Every relationship has those first heady moments when you want to know all about the other person, when you want to spend all your time with them. Think of calling or texting your friend immediately after returning from seeing them at school; spending hours thinking of a special person for whom you have deep feelings; new parents completely enthralled by this beautiful miracle created with God.

Yet things can easily become rote: the perfunctory kiss goodbye to a spouse or child as they leave for their day; the everyday “how are you?” to a co-worker or friend. This is true even with our faith.

Today we celebrate the Most Holy Trinity: dogma in the most profound and mysterious sense. Do we give much thought to this? The Sign of the Cross is meant to remind us of this intensely intimate relationship within the Trinity and with us. Blessing ourselves is often reflexive, done during Mass and the course of our daily living: before a test, when hearing bad news, or before that field goal attempt at 4th and goal. However, this Sign is our link, our bond, with God. It reinforces our “adoption” as children of God. We enter this union as active participants. We are not to be passive; we are not to be idle.

Our reading from Matthew today is known as the “Great Commission.” The remaining Apostles were called by Christ to spread the Good News. Despite loving Jesus, despite enjoying a deeply personal relationship with Him, they still “doubted.” How were they to fulfill all that Jesus asked of them? “Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you.” These past weeks we have heard that Jesus did not leave them unprepared. Grace and strength given to them by the Holy Trinity supported them in their mission and in turn enables generations to know the mercy and compassion of God.

We have received our commission:  
*“We are called to act with justice.  
 We are called to love tenderly.  
 We are called to serve one another,  
 to walk humbly with God.”*  
 Let’s remember that nothing “so great ever happened before.” Or since. Fr. Posey

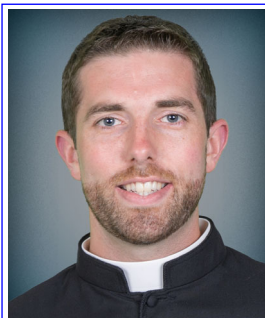

# Response to Coronavirus Public Celebrations of Mass

DIOCESE of ARLINGTON

## GUIDE for the LAY FAITHFUL May 25, 2021

Changes are based upon direction from Bishop Burbidge based upon the recent release of Executive Order 79.

### What To Know

On May 28, Executive Order (EO 79) lifts nearly all previous directives. It changes masks requirements. **Our churches will follow these changes and operate similar to pre-COVID-19.**

**Dispensation** • All the faithful of the Diocese of Arlington are **dispensed from the obligation to attend Mass** on Sundays and holydays of obligation until further notice. **At this time, the dispensation remains in effect. Further announcements regarding this matter will be conveyed in the near future.**

**Schedules** • Bishop Burbidge has requested that all parishes return to pre-COVID schedules for Mass, Adoration, and access to the parish.

**Livestreamed Masses** • At the pastor's discretion, livestreamed Masses may continue for the benefit of the homebound.

**Person-Per-Gathering Limits** • Per EO 79, there are no gathering limitations. Parishioners should expect to see larger crowds as they return to Mass.

**Social Distancing** • Per EO 79, there are no social distancing requirements.

**Disinfecting** • Per EO 79, there are no pandemic-like requirements for disinfecting and cleaning. Parishes should still continue a reasonable and effective cleaning regimen.

### Preparing

**Face Coverings** • Parishes shall follow the guidelines of EO 79 and the CDC's "Interim Recommendations for Fully Vaccinated People":

- Fully vaccinated persons no longer need to wear a mask in any setting.
- Unvaccinated persons are encouraged to wear face coverings per EO 79.
- No one shall inquire into the vaccination status of parishioners.
- No one shall be barred from entering a church or facility for not wearing a face covering.

**Sign-ups** • Because there are no gathering limits, sign-up platforms will be discontinued.

**Hand Hygiene** • Parishes have the *option* of providing hand sanitizer.

### Celebrating

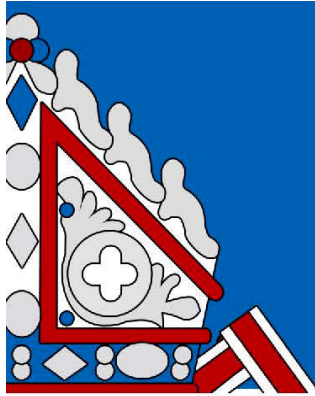
**Liturgical Elements** • The following liturgical elements that were suspended or modified may now be reintroduced:

- Holy water in fonts
- Worship aids
- Singing by full choirs and the faithful
- Collection baskets
- Presentation of the gifts by the lay faithful
- The sign of peace (without physical contact between non-family members)

### Communion

- The Diocese continues to suppresses the distribution of the Precious Blood until further notice.
- At the pastor's discretion - deacons, instituted acolytes, and Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion may distribute Communion.
- Parishioners should follow the procedures of their parish for the distribution of Communion.
- Each communicant retains the right to decide how to receive, either on the tongue or in the hand.
- It is not permitted to receive Communion in the hand while wearing gloves. If you are wearing gloves and will receive Communion in the hand, please remove your gloves prior to the reception of Communion.

## Celebraciones públicas de la Misa

### GUÍA para los FIELES LAICOS

Mayo 25, 2021

Cambios efectuados bajo la dirección de Monseñor Burbidge de conformidad con la reciente publicación de la Orden Ejecutiva 79.

#### Lo que deben saber

El 28 de mayo, por medio de la Orden Ejecutiva (EO 79) se cancelan casi todas las directrices anteriores. Se cambian los requisitos sobre el uso de máscaras. **Nuestras Iglesias seguirán estos cambios y funcionarán de manera similar a la establecida antes de la COVID-19.**

**Dispensa** • Todos los fieles de la Diócesis de Arlington están dispensados de la obligación de asistir a la Misa los domingos y días de obligación hasta nuevo aviso. En este momento, la dispensa sigue en vigor. Se enviarán otros anuncios al respecto en el futuro próximo.

**Horarios** • Monseñor Burbidge ha solicitado que todas las parroquias vuelvan al horario de Misas, Adoración y acceso a las parroquias existente antes de la COVID.

**Misas transmitidas en vivo** • A discreción del párroco, se pueden seguir transmitiendo las Misas en vivo para beneficio de las personas confinadas a la casa.

**Limitaciones del número de personas por reunión** • Según la Orden Ejecutiva 79, no hay limitación para las reuniones. Los feligreses deben esperar que haya una mayor congregación de fieles cuando vuelvan a la Misa.

**Distanciamiento social** • Según la Orden Ejecutiva 79, no hay requisitos de distanciamiento social.

**Desinfección** • Según la Orden Ejecutiva 79, no hay requisitos de desinfección y limpieza como los establecidos durante la pandemia. Las parroquias deben seguir con un régimen de limpieza razonable y efectivo.

#### Preparación

**Cobertura facial** • Las parroquias deben seguir las directrices de la Orden Ejecutiva 79 y las recomendaciones interinas para las personas totalmente vacunadas, establecidas por los Centros para el Control y la Prevención de Enfermedades (CDC):

- Las personas totalmente vacunadas ya no necesitan usar máscara en ningún lugar.
- Se anima a las personas no vacunadas a llevar una cobertura facial, de conformidad con lo dispuesto en la Orden Ejecutiva 79.

- Nadie preguntará si los feligreses se han vacunado o no.
- A nadie se le impedirá entrar a una iglesia o a cualquier edificación por no usar cobertura facial.

**Plataformas de firmas para reuniones** • Puesto que no hay límites para reunirse, se descontinuarán las plataformas de firmas para reuniones.

**Higiene de las manos** • Las parroquias tienen la opción de proporcionar desinfectante para las manos.

#### Celebración

**Elementos litúrgicos** • Los siguientes elementos litúrgicos previamente suspendidos o modificados pueden volver a introducirse:

- Agua bendita en las fuentes
- Ayudas para el culto
- Canto del coro y de los fieles
- Canastas de colecta
- Presentación de las ofrendas por los fieles laicos
- La señal de la paz (sin contacto físico entre personas que no son familiares)

#### Comunión

- La Diócesis continúa suprimiendo la distribución de la Preciosísima Sangre hasta nuevo aviso.
- A discreción del párroco, los diáconos, los acólitos instituidos y los Ministros Extraordinarios de la Sagrada Comunión pueden distribuir la Comunión.
- Los fieles deben seguir los procedimientos de su parroquia para la distribución de la Comunión.
- Cada comulgante se reserva el derecho de decidir cómo quiere recibir la Comunión, sea en la lengua o en la mano.
- No se permite recibir la Comunión en la mano mientras la

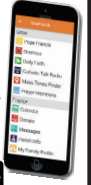
